RECYCLE RIGHT



Reduce. Reuse. Recycle.

It's not always obvious what can be recycled, and just because an item has the recycling symbol does not mean it is recyclable in your area. Follow the County's Recycle Right guides to figure out which materials can be recycled in your city.

Tip #2: Rethink Your Purchases, Big and Small

REPAIR BEFORE YOU REPLACE



Repair instead of replacing with new.

Don't be afraid to ask for help! Take your worn-out boots to a cobbler, your ripped jacket to a tailor, your broken bike to a repair shop. Check out the Repair Cafés, which hold in-person and virtual events where volunteers help fix your broken items.

SHIFT YOUR MINDSET



Buy used if possible.

If buying new, look for durable, high-quality items that can be repaired or recycled by the company you purchased from. Consider companies that employ fair trade/fair labor practices, responsible manufacturing, and sustainable materials and shipping practices.

BENEFIT FROM CLEAN ENERGY REBATES



Home improvement project?

Homeowners can receive up to \$5,000 in rebates for installing electric space heating, electric water heating, clothes drying, and induction cooking ranges. These upgrades help you save energy and money and improve indoor air quality. You can also receive rebates on products like smart thermostats or search for energy efficient products marketplace.
